

How long will this take?

This program will take as little or as long as you would like; it really varies per person. The more effort you put into the program by attending classes regularly and doing homework, the sooner you will be ready to take the HSED (high school equivalency diploma) test.

When can I register for this program?

We have open registration, so just call to schedule class hours and we will get you started. Click [here](#) to submit a request on-line.

Do I need to bring anything to register for this program?

For your first class, you will need your Indiana driver’s license or a state identification card (ID) and your social security number. That is all you need; we will provide you with the rest. If you do not have an ID, you can still enroll, but you must have one to take the HSED test.

I’m a minor, do I need to bring my parent or guardian?

Yes, to register for this program you will need a parent or guardian to sign for you, as well as a signed exit interview form from your previous principal and/or superintendent.

How much does this program cost?

The classes do not cost money, just time and effort. The HSED test has fees which are \$115 total for all five (5) subject areas.

Can I bring my child to class?

We do not encourage this practice because it can be a distraction to you and others.

Do I have to stay the whole class time?

No, you do not. We recommend students average around 2 to 3 hours a day in class. It is totally up to you.

Will I have homework?

Yes, you will have homework. There is no punishment if you do not do it, but we highly recommend you complete it, so we can go over it at your next class and see what we need to work on. Sometimes the homework is online if that is what you prefer.

Can I work from home?

Yes, however your first 12 hours must be done in class. After that we can provide online programs and homework packets to you to achieve distance education hours.

How will you know when I am ready to take the HSED test?

Your instructor will help you decide when you are ready. At a minimum, you must have at least 12 hours of in-class instruction and show improvement on your post-test. You will also take TASC Readiness Tests that demonstrate your ability to pass the official test.

What if I do not pass all 5 parts of the test?

If for some reason you do not pass a section of the test, then you just have to retake that section. You do not have to retake sections you have passed already.

I was in a HSED program before and passed some tests, but did not finish does that count?

Once you start taking the HSED tests, you have 60 days to complete it. So if it has been longer than that, you will have to start over.

I am a hands-on learner? Can you help me?

Our classes are designed to be one-on-one and to meet the needs of each individual student. We have lots of resources to use so you can succeed.

I am afraid employers or colleges will look down on the HSED?

A HSED is an acceptable certification of high school equivalency completion and perfectly fine with employers and colleges.

Can this program help me with career exploration, colleges, funding for colleges, and/or skills certification?

Yes, we work with you finding the right path after you have achieved your HSED. We have you take a career exploration survey so we can look at your strengths and values and guide you from them. We work with WorkOne and the programs they offer.

I was in a GED program before, but did not finish does that count?

No, Indiana does not use the GED program.

What if I had accommodations (IEP) in high school?

We can send a copy of your Individual Education Plan (IEP) to the state and have them approve your accommodations, so you can have them on your post-test as well as your high school equivalency test (HSED)
